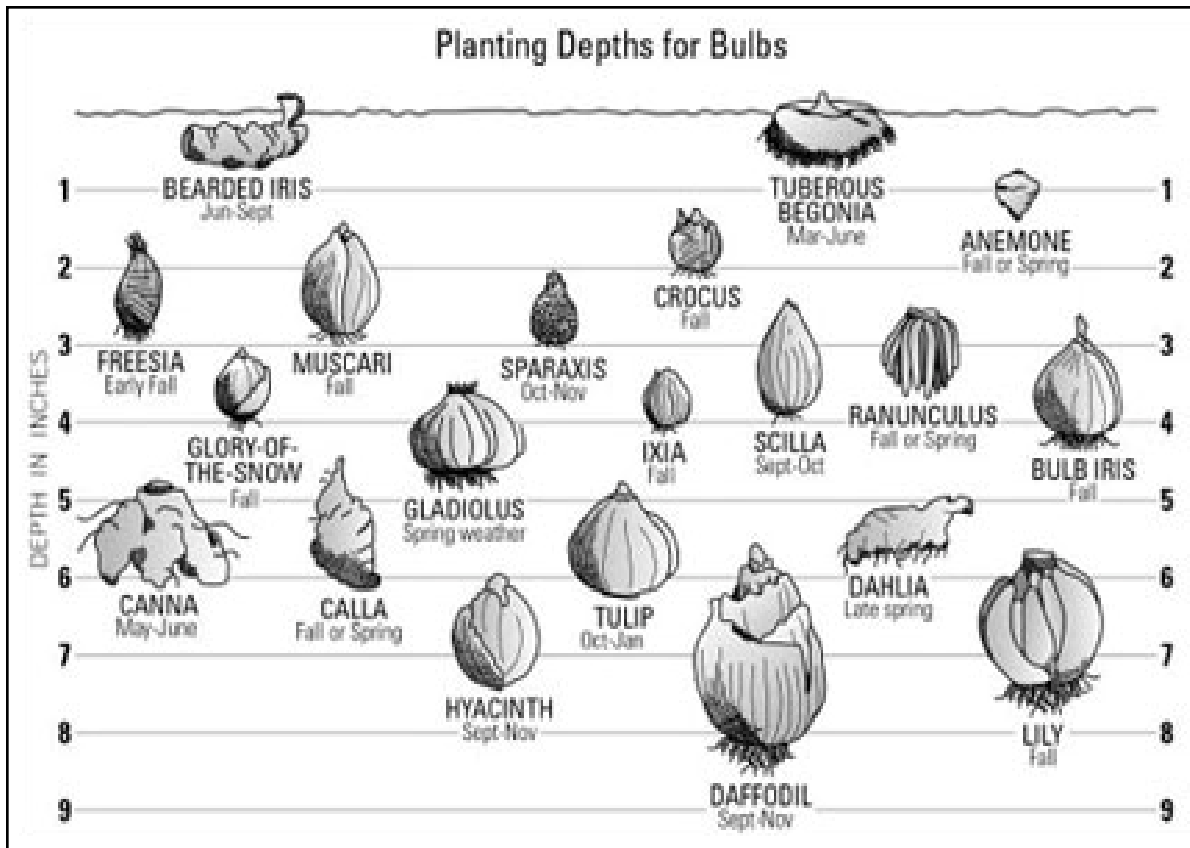

Bulbs for naturalizing

The plants listed here are vigorous and self-reliant, and should perform well across a wide range of hardiness zones. Plant the bulbs pointed end up, root end down.

Species	Planting depth	Space between bulbs	Hardiness
Drumstick allium (<i>Allium sphaerocephalon</i>)	2 to 4 inches	2 to 8 inches	Zones 4 - 10
Wild hyacinths, Quamash (<i>Camassia</i> spp. and cvs.)	4 inches	4-8 inches	Zones 4 - 9
Glory of the snow (<i>Chionodoxa</i> spp. and cvs.)	3 inches	1 to 2 inches	Zones 3 - 9
Crocus (<i>Crocus</i> spp. and cvs.)	3 inches	2 to 3 inches	Zones 3 - 8
Checkered lily (<i>Fritillaria meleagris</i>)	3 to 4 inches	3 to 4 inches	Zones 3 - 8
Snowdrops (<i>Galanthus</i> spp. and cvs.)	3 inches	2 to 3 inches	Zones 3 - 9
Bluebells (<i>Hyacinthoides</i> spp. and cvs.)	3 inches	3 to 4 inches	Zones 4 - 9
Spring starflower (<i>Ipheion uniflorum</i>)	3 inches	2 to 3 inches	Zones 6 - 9
Bulbous irises (<i>Iris histrioides, I. reticulata</i>)	4 to 6 inches	4 to 5 inches	Zones 5 - 8
Snowflakes (<i>Leucojum</i> spp. and cvs.)	3 to 4 inches	4 to 8 inches	Zones 4 - 9
Grape hyacinths (<i>Muscari</i> spp. and cvs.)	3 to 4 inches	2 inches	Zones 4 - 9
Daffodils and jonquils (<i>Narcissus</i> spp. and cvs.)	4 to 7 inches	4 to 7 inches	Zones 3 - 9
Siberian squill (<i>Scilla siberica</i>)	3 to 4 inches	2 to 3 inches	Zones 5 - 8

Companion Plants with Similar Blooming Periods

Allium	hostas, laburnum, wisteria, dicentra
Anemone	daffodils, cornus florida, tulips
Asiatic lilies	alliums, daylilies, coreopsis
Crocus species	lawn grasses, iris reticulata, johnny-jump-ups
Daffodils (early)	forsythia, berried shrubs, jasminum nudiflorum, kaufmanniana tulips
Daffodils (midseason)	magnolia stellata, early tulips, prunus
Daffodils (late)	brunnera, sprieas, columbine, cornus florida, tulips, leucojum
Daffodils (miniature)	helleborus, phlox sublet, sedums, ajuga
Dutch iris	peonies, Siberian Iris, allium moly, digitalis, Sweet William, roses
Hyacinthoides (scilla)	alliums, polygonum, chrysanthemums
Hyacinth	pansies, viola tricolor, daffodils, tulips
Leucojum	late daffodils, midseason tulips, mahonia, muscari, hyacinthoides
Muscari	daffodils, tulips, anemones
Oriental lilies	cleome, phlox, verbena bonariensis, achillea, Queen Anne's Lace
Tulips (early)	sweet slyssum, prunus, daffodils
Tulips (midseason)	crab apples, azaleas, pansies, rhododendrons
Tulips (late)	fritillaria, late daffodils, lunaria, English daisies
Tulips (miniature)	anemone blanda, viola tricolor, stachys, herbs
